



## PRE-ELECTION COALITION POLITICAL PARTIES AGREEMENTS AND THEIR CONSTITUENT PARTIES

The Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) is established under Section 33 of the Political Parties Act, 2011 (PPA) as a State Office within the meaning of Article 260 of the Constitution.
